CDT Group, based at Greenwich, SE8, are among the top winners in this year's National Green Apple Environment Awards. They won National Silver in the Products category.

Winners were presented with their trophies at The House of Commons, where they were guests of Health Secretary Patricia Hewitt. Former England cricket captain Allan Lamb presented the trophies.

Commenting on the success, the judges said:

"In the past two years 1,000 CopyBoxes and PrintBoxes from the eXair range have been installed in the workplace to create a better working environment. These products capture the emissions from office equipment to eliminate carbon monoxide, various VOCs, ozone and other harmful by-products."

This is the eleventh year of the Green Apple Awards, now established as one of the biggest environmental award schemes in the world.

The organisers invite entries from any council, company, community or country that is making an effort to protect or enhance the environment, with categories to cover every sector of commerce, industry, groups and local government. There were almost 1,000 entries this year.

There is also a Spanish holiday prize for the overall winner of the national title, this year won by Grundfos Pumps.

The Green Apple Awards are supported by the Environment Agency, the Chartered Institution of Wastes Management, the Municipal Journal and numerous other official bodies.

The international campaign is led by The Green Organisation, an independent, non-political, non-activist, non-profit environment group dedicated to recognising, rewarding and promoting environmental best practice around the world.

National Organiser Roger Wolens commented: "This winning paper will now be published with a selection of others in Green Heroes, the international work of reference on environmental best practice that enables many thousands around the world to learn and benefit from the achievements of our winners
